This will be a member's only exhibition.

Pop in and buy a hamburger during the entire month of December the Ipswich Art Society Inc will be incorporated on a Local Matters jar to help promote


awareness of our groups Art's activities to the community.

The Dream of St Joseph

Philippe de Champaigne, National Gallery, London



In the Gospel of Matthew, is pledged marriage to Joseph when discovers she he pregnant. In consternation, he decides to continue with the marriage but with future divorce in mind. But God sends an angel to Joseph in a dream to explain the divine conception and ask him to name the baby Jesus. The French painter Champaigne is one of very few artists to depict Joseph's story, imagining his dilemma and this angelic intervention. And just like a figure in a dream, the angel speaks without words, explaining the mystery entirely in sign language.
