



ONE OF AUSTRALIA'S GREAT SCULPTURES...



William Ricketts Sanctuary, situated at the entrance of the beautiful Dandenong Ranges National Park near Melbourne.

William was born in Victoria in 1898 and devoted his life to creating these magnificent sculptures out of native trees and clay.


He had a deep, powerful vision of modern Australia and embraced Aboriginal spirituality and great respect for the natural world which was the message he tried to portray though his artworks.

Although not of Aboriginal blood he made frequent trips to the Pitjantjatjara nation in

Central Australia and considered himself adopted by them. . He never had formal training. He never became rich, but lived off his commissions and sales of smaller works

William took time out later in life, to develop his skills in playing the violin, crafting jewellery and clay modelling.

Creativity had only just began to emerge as in 1934 he began his last and most impressive project with the creation of the Williams Ricketts Sanctuary.

He passed away in 1993.
