




The Ipswich Art Society are pleased to be hosting their weekly tutored watercolour classes on a Saturday with professional tutor Lorelle Boyce.



Mein Kampf (My Struggle)



The following is a very small slice of life, out of one of the most infamous leaders of our time. Adolf Hitler. His interest in art began in his youth. He did not do especially well at school and spent many hours languishing by the Danube with his best friend, August Mubarak. He dropped

out of high school at the young age of sixteen. His, one and only best friend, quickly

became aware that Hitler didn't cope with disapproval by others and spent hours of theatrically orientated oratorical sessions with him, delivering his view of the world. Hitler displayed a love of music and was an ardent fan of Wagner, he spent every moment drawing and doing watercolours. He spent many hours languishing beside the Danube River in his teen years, he never worked as he could not cope with taking





orders from a boss figure. After his father died his world was turned around and he was free to do as he choose. Late morning rises and dressing like a fine gentleman complete with an ivory cane, he whiled away the hours visiting museums and drawing. He decided to become an artist and visited Vienna, tried to gain entry twice to the Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna, but was rejected as his work was not up to the standards required.

They did however advise him that he was architecturally inclined. Surprisingly, he was known to see an ornate

building once, going home and painting it from memory with a haunting exactness. This was somewhat of a turning point in his life. His mother had just died of cancer and he devoted himself to becoming a leader. Upon becoming chancellor, with his extreme knowledge of art, music and culture in general, he declared that there were two kinds of art. One type, Modern Art was done by sick production of crazy people. Pity the people who can't control their sickness." Hitler's preferred art was leaning towards romantic





images. Pictures should never project any pity, anguish or pain. A

strange comment from a man who caused so much pain, anguish and sorrow by so many. He believed that artists should depict colours much brighter than those in nature and landscapes in Austria were his preferred scenes, with a little rural life thrown in.
