



This will be discussed at the Meeting on Monday the 6th February at the Ipswich Library.






JEST A MINUTE

ARTISTS ARE VERY SCARY PEOPLE!



Or so it was reported in the 1950's. When US Senator, Joseph McCarthy decreed that artists who sang songs with messages that questioned authority were subpoenaed under McCarthyism period that occurred just after the Korean war, all outspoken artists were labelled subversive. Top names such as

Leonard Bernstein, playwright Arthur Mill and folk singer Pete Seeger of "If I had a Hammer" fame were asked to perform at a Communist hosted Dinner, their feelings projected in their song were not appreciated. They were punished for expressing their feelings in their music, no matter what were their political ambitions or affiliations. Seeger and his co-author Hayes were blacklisted and were

unable to play or sing or be televised at any entertainment venue for many years. To further emphasise the hard ships that artists of times gone by suffered, in 1848, King Leopold 1st of the Belgians wrote to his niece, the then Queen Victoria, of the influence of artists upon the populace to which she answered "The powers that be are always afraid of creative spirits."
